Delaware, Ohio. The Supreme Court of the United States has agreed to hear the D.C. Gun Ban case. In a brief, one sentence order, the Court agreed to decide the following issue:

Whether the following provisions, D.C. Code §§ 7-2502.02(a)(4), 22-4504(a), and 7-2507.02, violate the Second Amendment rights of individuals who are not affiliated with any state-regulated militia, but who wish to keep handguns and other firearms for private use in their homes.

Based upon prior experience and likely briefing schedules, the case would likely be argued in March and decided immediately prior to recess in approximately July of 2008.

Of additional interest, the SCOTUS apparently did not agree to here Shelly Parker's attempt to remain a party in the case, meaning Mr. Heller is the only party remaining. It had been hoped that the SCOTUS would allow all of the original parties to make their arguments.
